# Back-to-School May Bring New Friends, Some Unwelcomed

Getting back to school is fun and exciting for both children and their parents. Meeting new friends and teachers, starting new classes, and scheduling soccer practices quickly push summer to the side and sets fall into motion. Getting the kids to the right place at the right time may seem like the biggest priority during this time of year but there is one other thing that will make your head scratch...head lice!

With children eager to learn and see their friends after a long summer away from school, kids are going to be spending a lot of time with each other and closely at that! Although sharing is nice, It is important to educate young ones on the importance of **not sharing hats, combs, brushes, pillows, or hair accessories** with their friends.



Why do kids get lice? Head lice are spread mainly by direct head-to-head contact with a person who already has head lice. Lice move by crawling and can easily travel from child to child because children play closely together and often in large groups.

Contrary to popular belief, head lice have nothing to do with poor hygiene and are very common in the U.S. When researchers tested large groups of children to see how many have lice, they found that close to 10% do. There is no proof that lice prefer clean or dirty hair. They feed on blood, not dirt or skin cells on the scalp. Whether or not lice prefer long hair over short hair is still unclear.

#### What's the Treatment?

According to the National Library of Medicine, topical treatments containing 1% permethrin (Nix) work well to treat head lice at home. These products are available here at Sand Run Pharmacy. If this method does not work, prescription products are available as well. Always use lice treatments exactly as directed because using them too often or incorrectly can cause side effects. Don't hesitate to call us here at the pharmacy if you have any questions or concerns.

Additionally, be sure to wash all clothes and bedding with hot water and detergent when treating head lice. This process will also help prevent the spreading of lice to others during the short time they can survive away from the human body. Talk to our friendly staff here at the pharmacy if you are unsure if a person sharing bedding or clothes with an infested person will need to be treated as well.
