Myth #1: Healthy people do not get the flu.

- ✗ Again, false. Your risk will be lower. If you do get the flu, it will be less severe.

Myth #3: The vaccine contains a virus, and it causes the flu.

- ✗ FALSE! The vaccine cannot give you the flu!

The flu is a virus that infects the lungs, and it is more dangerous in certain groups of people. That is, they are more likely to go to the hospital if they get the flu, and they are the ones who need a flu shot the most. This includes people who:

- Are older than 50 or younger than 18
- Are pregnant or plan to become pregnant
- Have diabetes, asthma, or high blood pressure
- Have kidney or liver disease
- Have HIV or AIDS

If you live with someone in one of these high risk groups, it is especially important that you get a flu shot as well. If you get the flu, you could spread it to them.
